







sat down with him to do a podcast, see PNTV on youtube or our website to view the conversation.





Autism Inclusion at Prospect North Primary School

In March 2022, the South Australian Government announced an initiative to improve support for children on the autism spectrum. Each school was allocated funding by the Department for Education for an Autism Inclusion Teacher (AIT). My name is Sarah Pressler and I am the Autism Inclusion Teacher at Prospect North Primary School. On Wednesdays, my AIT role focuses on strengthening our school community's inclusion of students on the autism spectrum.

The Department for Education provides an Autism Inclusion Multidisciplinary (AIM) team to support me in the AIT role. The team includes, senior advisor educators, developmental educator, psychologist, occupational therapist, speech pathologist and an Aboriginal cultural project officer. The information from the AIM team is evidence-based and informed by the autistic and autism community.

My role as an AIT is to support colleagues, students and families. I pass on information, resources and training I receive from the AIM team on how to best

support and educate autistic students. I am happy to talk with you about my role or how I can support you and your child.

I look am looking forward to being a part of your child's learning journey this year.
