

A lot has been happening in the STEM at our school, with three big events involving PNPS students happening in the last two weeks.

Friday of Week 3 saw our school hosting South Australia's first official First Lego League Junior Expo in our Gym. This follows on from our really successful local expo last year, and it featured six teams from our school with two visiting teams from St Aloysius. Each team had up to six students and the Expo was the culmination of over ten weeks of work in the Mission Moon season where they learnt about outer space and the Moon, then collaborated to design their own Moon Base using Lego that presented solutions to the problems of air, water and energy.

Senior students from the Synergetix and Lego Lunar-tics helped to run the Expo – they did an amazing job and were wonderful role models for our budding middle primary STEM enthusiasts.

Feedback for the reviewers was extremely positive. The reviewers were very impressed with how the students used creativity and persistence to explore new skills and ideas and design solutions to solve problems they faced. The students demonstrated great confidence when explaining their Moon Base and Show me Poster and how they built and tested and worked collaboratively. Their models were detailed and their solutions to problems such as clean air, water, energy and food were innovative.

The Expo was the opportunity to share their learning by displaying their models and their learning on a team ShowMe poster. Our mentor, Mr Dominic Iacopetta (participant Lucas's grandfather and our principal, Marg were our official Reviewers to help determine trophy awards for the teams. Each trophy was awarded according to a number of key features that each team demonstrated to the panel of judges throughout the expo.

The Expo was enjoyed by all and well done to all of the students who participated.














Last Thursday, we held the follow up to our Kids Teach STEM conference with neighbouring schools. Each school shared how they were looking to improve Student Voice within their site and help students to be in charge of their own learning. The conference was capably hosted by Year 4 Digital Leaders Bella, Bree and Sarah who led the schools through a STEM Challenge in the afternoon based on the Junior Lego League season theme.







Then on Saturday, three First Lego League teams (FLIT, Lego LUNAR-tics and Synergetix) competed in the Regional Robotics tournament held at Immanuel College. On the day, each team had to compete in Robot Matches that showed their coding skills to complete as many missions as possible within a two and a half minute time limit. They also had to present a Research Project to judges on the season's theme of Into Orbit and present their solution to a problem that would be faced by astronauts on a space mission. They also met with judges to discuss their Robot Design and also to share their Core Values posters which is all about teamwork and collaboration.

All three teams did really well with two teams winning trophies at the closing ceremony – Synergetix won the Robot Design award and Lego LUNAR-tics won the Robot Strategy and Innovation. Both teams have also qualified and been invited to compete again at the State Championship to be held at Pedare College, Golden Grove on Saturday the 24th of November. All team members represented our school well and should be proud of their efforts in a very challenging competition.

Thanks to Marg and Gail Powers for giving up their personal time to coach and support the students.

Premier's Reading Challenge

The Premier's Reading Challenge is a literacy engagement program that was introduced by the Premier in 2004 to encourage students to read more books and enjoy reading to improve literacy levels. The Challenge requires students to read 12 books between the beginning of the school year and early September. Some students have participated every year since the award began.

This year we had a total 233 students complete the Premier's Reading challenge!

65 students receive participation certificates for their first year of participation.

67 students receive Bronze Awards for two years participation.

41 students receive Silver Awards for three years participation.

29 students receive Gold Awards for four years participation.

11 students have participated for five years, and have achieved the Champion Award this year:

Helpful Ideas for Parents and Caregivers

Find time to play with your children

Praise and encourage your child, praise for effort is more important than the end result The social and physical interaction that occurs between you and your child is very important. Try to include activities that bring you together

Remember, children learn by doing

Observe children at play. Offer assistance only when children are unable to do it for themselves



Include some activities that your child can do well. Success is a great reward. Use activities or games that your child suggests.

Instead of saying "What is it?" when talking about children's creative work, say, "Would you like to tell me about it?" or "Show me what it does"

> Do not crush children's ideas, but add something to them to make them fit into the pattern

Be interested in what they are interested in and be sensitive to their moods. On any creative work, encourage children to work out their own ideas. Give children a choice; nothing is gained when there is a clash of wills!

And finally,

Give them every opportunity possible to 'live' what you want them to learn

Thursday 29th November, 2018



used the design thinking process to make a weather model.

Immersion: In the immersion stage we started with a *talking tub* that contained weather related photos such as wind, rain, clouds, a storm, a weather map, a windmill, a weather vane...plus many more. There were also items including a thermometer and rain gauge.

After choosing a photo and talking about it students recorded questions and wonderings.



We had fun experiencing 'weather' in our classrooms by turning up the heating to make it really warm and then on another occasion putting on the air conditioner to make it cold. *Cloudy with a Chance of Meatballs* was a delightful animated movie we watched that was also part of the immersion stage. This movie was a great example of a boy growing up who loved inventing and made a prototype followed by many



Setting the goal: students chose a model they wanted to make that was related to weather in some way. (eg. rain gauge, wind mill, wind

turbine, fire danger sign, weather vane...) They set their goal and drew a labelled design of their chosen model.

Prototype: Students had a first go at making a model.

Feedback and feedforward: Students recorded feedback and feedforward to their partner of the prototype weather model. They could then use the feedforward to help improve their model or even start over. Feedback and feedforward can be repeated as often as needed, sometimes orally.

Reflection: When possible, students test their models to see if they work. They reflect on their model orally and with a photo using Seesaw as well as a written reflection in their investigation book.


