## **Studio 9 News**

Students in Studio 9 are measuring the area of class characters "Dead Bob," "Sponge Bob," and "B.O.B." This activity helps them develop skills in calculating area using arrays, formulas, and strategies for breaking down complex shapes. They are learning the split strategy and how to calculate the area of right-angled triangles. As they apply these concepts, students decide whether to use decimals or round to whole numbers.

We have seen them working together to assess their measuring techniques, supporting each other with calculations, and being resourceful by checking their results. They are also using encouragement to uplift their peers.

This task encourages them to be selfmanagers, team players, creative and critical thinkers, and explorers. We are curious to see which character takes up the greatest area!
















T15 and T16 have been learning measurement through competing in Olympic events: sprints, weightlifting, gymnastics, and diving. It has been great to see students so engaged in their maths learning, and to see the connections students make to their prior knowledge and experiences. Week. We started the week with Sorry Day and our
Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander learners were well
prepared and keen to share their knowledge and
experience with the rest of the school community. A
group of students worked with Danni and Kylie's
Reception classes to make Whirlies with natural
collected materials from Nature Play. The students were
Expert Learners as they had created these designs when
they were in Reception and Year 1.



Over the first 2 days,
Aunty Tissa, Eli, Mia,
Latisha, Issy and Toby were
able to get around to
many classes and share
the 2008 Apology from
Prime Minister Kevin Rudd.
Over the rest of the week,
we worked with every
class across the school
sharing our Culture.







Eli played guitar and we sang a Torres
Strait Islander song 'Inanay', which is
where Latisha and Helis' ancestors come
from, in Tiwi Language accompanied by
clapping sticks. Latisha, Mia, Frankie
and Issy demonstrated their art skills and
worked with classes creating
Boomerangs and Family Stories. Aunty
Tissa read her own Family Story painted
by her son and one she had painted 20
years ago.







All students learnt about Visual
Literacy and how to read a
painting. Eli and Aaron
demonstrated how to throw
different Boomerangs on the oval
and the Year 6's especially
enjoyed watching their skill
mastery. We created a video with
Sammy and we also did a
podcast with Aaron and Mia's
dad Quinton and Zaniya and
Zhavia's mum Taleisha, about
being Aboriginal and their school
experiences.

The highlight of the week was having a end of week party and inviting a friend to the Nunga Room and show what true Reconciliation is all about. Well done to our mob!



# Reception HASS



The reception classes have been learning about our families.

We have been focusing on houses and homes and have incorporated STEM and Design Technology into our lessons.





First, we looked at photos of our own homes and learnt about the different types of homes that people live in. We then drew blueprints of the front of our houses using photos. Once we had done this, we had a go at building models of our homes using Lego.
